Pennsylvania Primary Elections rescheduled to June 2, 2020



On March 27th Governor Wolf signed into law Senate Bill 422, which reschedules the 2020 primary election from April 28, 2020 to June 2, 2020, due to the COVID -19 emergency. This measure also allows counties to temporarily consolidate polling places, so please be sure to check for any changes before you head to the polls on June 2nd.

The deadline for voter registration **HAS** also been extended to <u>May 18, 2020</u>. If you have not registered to vote yet please do so <u>here</u>.

Additionally, Pennsylvania voters now have the option to vote by mail-in ballot rather than going to a polling place on Election Day. Please keep in mind that mail-in ballots and absentee ballots are being classified differently by the state. A helpful comparison tool has been published by the state to clarify these differences and can be viewed here.

As grass roots advocates one of the most important tools we have is our right to vote. So please join myself and millions of others this year as we **#Act4MentalHealth**!
